63. APOLOGY FOR ABSENCE

An apology for absence was received from Councillor P.G. Gwyther.

64. MINUTES

PROPOSED by Councillor Mrs. P.E. George SECONDED by Councillor R.F. Finbow

RESOLVED -

That the Minutes of the Meeting held on the 6th July, 2000 be adopted as circulated, subject to the following amendments:-

65. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

(a) Minute 54(b) - Llanion Park - Artefacts

The Mayor, Councillor Mrs. P.E.M. Folland stated that she had attended the re-dedication ceremony of the plaques at Haverfordwest but had not been invited to the function at the Cleddau Bridge Hotel that evening.

RESOLVED -

That the Town Clerk write to Pembrokeshire County Council to establish a date when the plaques will be returned to the Town Council in line with the agreement reached in February, 2000.

(b) Minute 54(c) - Pater Hall Gates

(i) Minute 67(ix) - Pembroke Dock Old Peoples Welfare Committee

Councillor Mrs. V.M.J. Roach stated that the contribution earmarked for the above Committee was increased last year from £400 to £500 to include the costs of their summer trip and it was

(j) Minute 56 - The Market - Public Conveniences

Councillor Mrs. V.M.J. Roach enquired as to whether it is Pembrokeshire County Council's intention to demolish the Market as the toilet facility is an integral part of the Market.

The Town Clerk stated that he had discussed this matter with Pembrokeshire County Council who had advised that they do not intend to demolish the Market.

(k) Minute 61(d) - Lloyds Bank - Scaffolding

The Town Clerk stated that he had contacted the Secretary who had confirmed the precise name of the Band which is the Pembroke Borough Silver Band.

72. Audit of Accounts

The Town Clerk reported that the audit of accounts for the year ended 31st March, 2000 was carried out by the District Auditor on the 7th June, 2000.

Reproduced at Appendix "A" were copies of the financial statements as presented to the District Auditor. The following matters had been raised:-

(a) <u>Tourism Committee</u>

The District Auditor queried whether the Tourism Committee had been granted plenary powers. He was assured by the former Town Clerk that plenary powers had been granted and had advised accordingly.

(b) Internal Audit

An internal audit of accounts should be carried out at least three times per annum. The Mayor and Deputy Mayor had been previously appointed as the Internal Auditors and the first audit for 2000/2001 would shortly be undertaken.

(c) Bank Account Balances

Reference had been made to the high balances held, and it was noted that work had not yet been carried out on the Pater Hall. If this work was not to be carried out the precept should be reduced to decrease balances.



The Town Clerk referred to the fact that with regard to the bank account balances there would of course be substantially reduced when the modernisation to Pater Hall was undertaken.

The Mayor and Members paid tribute to the Town Clerk for the excellent financial statements presented to the District Auditor. The Town Clerk stated that this work had been undertaken by the former Town Clerk, Mrs. W.A. Vincent.

RESOLVED -

That the Council record their appreciation to the former Town Clerk, Mrs. W.A. Vincent for the excellent work undertaken in the preparation of the financial statements presented to the District Auditor.

73. New Postage Franking Meter

The Town Clerk reported that the new franking meter had been received and was in use. In order to have the Council's name printed on the envelope a charge of £32 (+ VAT) is made by Pitney Bowes for the advertising plate.

RESOLVED -

That the Council do not proceed with the advertising plate on the postal franking machine.

74. Accountancy Computer Software

The Town Clerk referred to the Council's receipts and payments accounts and bank reconciliation calculations which are maintained on a now ageing computer programme which does not operate on the familiar "Windows" operating system. Difficulties had been encountered for some time especially in the printing of the accounts.

Members were informed that Westgate Computers of Pembroke Dock, had advised that it was now well past it's life expectancy and cannot be maintained. They had recommended the purchase of a Sage Accounting software package in which there is local tuition. Independent enquiries had confirmed that the software would be suitable and would operate on the Council's new computer. The cost of the software is currently £99. If this was agreed by the Council it was hoped to continue to use the existing programme for the current financial year and introduce the new package in April, 2001.

RESOLVED -

That the Town Clerk be authorised to purchase the Sage Accounting software package at a cost of £99.

75. Hire of Tables and Chairs

The Town Clerk reported that he had received a request from the Organisers of a Medieval Fayre in Lamphey for the hire of tables and chairs. A charge of 50p per table and 25p per chair is normally charged for hirings made to organisations in the Town. As this event is outside the Town the Council were requested to consider this matter.

RESOLVED -

That the Town Clerk be authorised to to hire out the tables and chairs referred to above.

76. Delegated Powers - Council Recess

The Town Clerk stated that it is customary for the Mayor, Deputy Mayor and Town Clerk to be authorised to deal with any urgent matters which arise during Council recess. It would therefore be appropriate for the Council to grant the necessary authority for the forthcoming period of recess.

82. Pembrokeshire Rail Travellers Association

The Town Clerk reported that the Association's Spring/Summer Newsletter had been received together with the Pembrokeshire Railway Guide for summer 2000. Both were available for Members' inspection.

83. Objective 1 European Funding

The Town Clerk reminded Members that an early indication had been given to the European Officer, Pembrokeshire County Council of the Council's intention of making application for Objective 1 funding for the upgrading of the Pater Hall complex. RE: 54 BUSH STREET, PEMBROKE DOCK.

I refer to your letter dated 14th July, 2000, in respect of the above.

I think that it would be most useful to briefly outline once again the context for this difficult problem.

On the 21st September, 1998, officers of the Building Control Division served notice on the owners of No. 54 Bush Street requiring them to remove the danger the building presented. Following a monitoring period it was detected that the front elevation was peeling away from the main body of the building and thereby presenting an unacceptable risk to the public. Clearly at this stage two potential options were available. Either the building was to be demolished or restrained in some fashion. No. 54 Bush Street is a 'listed' building and therefore a duty to preserve exists. The owners of the building were unable to carry out the work themselves and so the Council put in place the shoring scaffold. Because of our duty to preserve we applied to Cadw Welsh Historic Monuments for an acquisition grant to cover our costs of temporary works and then transfer the building to either the local Buildings Preservation Trust or Housing Association.

Cadw agreed conditional to transfer to the Preservation Trust. The Trust have since declined the offer of transfer and so we were left with the Housing Association as our only partner. The costs of repair are however so significant that there exists in the region of £180,000 shortfall between standard Housing Association funding levels and the cost of repair and reuse. Simply to take down and rebuild the front elevation would cost over £60,000. Running parallel with this however the Council were also developing its Townscape Heritage Initiative for the town with the Heritage Lottery Fund. The bidding process is now in the final stages and we can expect an offer from

the HLF of approaching £2 million which will, incidentally, make it the largest scheme funded to date in the U.K. Match funding will we anticipate combine to make a common fund of approaching £6 million. The Housing Association remain committed to the scheme and following our identification of 54 Bush Street as a critical project the funding is ring fenced. We expect to be in a position to administer grants in September.

It is, therefore, most probable that the scaffolding will be required until at least September.

I hope the above clarifies matters and provides you with a clearer understanding of the difficult issues that surround this project.

NOTES SUBMITTED BY COUNCILLOR M.B. OWEN PEMBROKE DOCK AND OBJECTIVE ONE

INTRODUCTION

Pembroke Dock is a pivotal "entry and exit" point from the County and Wales which has suffered terribly because of three main factors:-

- (1) Reduction in armed forces and closure of service bases and Dockyard;
- (2) Changing pattern of retail and habits of shoppers requiring "chain store" goods from cities;
- (3) Economic recession and a failure to rebuild in its wake

CURRENT POSITION

Currently, economically, the town is little more than bumping along the bottom.

It is no good looking to past glories and seeking to turn the clock back. We have to look forward to a very different town based upon an increasing importance as a ferry port; (new ferries to France and Spain now being mentioned quite openly) and as a heritage and tourist town.

Very different amenities now required from its previous existence, and a very different treatment is necessary when travel becomes increasingly easy and Europeans in particular are moving around frequently and regularly.

There seems neither urgency, enthusiasm, nor decision making by the County Council, leaving both them and us, in danger of being left behind, and may be excluded, from the benefits of Objective One.

Therefore, I propose, as a Council, that we submit our own scheme.

OUR OBJECTIVE ONE SCHEME

- (1) Create a continuous promenade from the Gun Tower on Front Street to as near to Hobbs Point as possible. (This necessitates relocation of Jewson's to a more suitable site on a trading/industrial site).
- (2) Create a properly organised stop over caravan and motor caravan park on half of the car park behind the Co-op with full amenities (w.c's, showers, laundry room and water and electricity points), properly staffed and open week before Easter to the end of October.
- (3) Meyrick Street is one of the few streets in Britain to be called a true boulevard so we should turn it into one. Plant trees on both sides from the Bush Street junction to Modern Print.
- (4) Turn the King William Street area into a woodland pathway from Tesco to the remainder of the town.
- (5) Dredge the area from Front Street Gun Tower to Hobbs Point to below lowest low tide level so there is water at all times.

Of these, Point 2 creates immediate jobs. The remainder, creates the environment for job creation.

I should like us all to think about this over the recess and return to discuss this at Council Meeting on the 28th September, 2000 when I have returned from holiday.

Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996

As I hope you will be aware, this Act is now in force throughout the whole of Pembrokeshire. The Act requires dog owners to clear up after their dogs on all land open to the public (with some exemptions). This means that there are much wider powers to control dog fouling. However, it will be an essential part of the process that the public inform us about problem areas, and provide details of dog owners who persistently flout Times, dates, names and addresses are crucial in compiling evidence and enforcing the law.

If an officer authorised under the Act sees a contravention ie a dog fouls and the owner does not clear up after it, the officer can issue a £25 fixed penalty ticket. Alternatively there are powers to prosecute in the Courts, with a fine of up to £1,000. Where a member of the public is able and willing to provide a statement about an offence identifying the person responsible and to attend Court if necessary, these incidents can be pursued through prosecution.

Warning letters will continue to be sent to alleged offenders, which is current practice.

I have attached some information and posters for your use. The posters can be photocopied and put up in shops and notice boards.

There are also adhesive stickers available and I enclose some samples.

The cost of the 100 x 150 stickers is 50 pence each and the cost of the 200 x 150 stickers is £1.00 each. These can be obtained in small numbers from this Department or ordered direct from a local printer. Unit prices of bulk orders from a printer are cheaper. Permanent signs are not provided by this Department, but metal plates are available in small numbers for use for the 200 x 150 stickers at a cost of £3.00 each, including sticker. This does not include fixing the plates which is done by the customer.

The Dog Wardens are available to give talks and presentations to your meetings if you make arrangements at least three weeks in advance. Please contact them at the Council Offices.

DOGS (FOULING OF LAND) ACT 1996

The Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 applies to England and Wales only. Local authorities have had powers for some time to control the fouling of land by dogs through Byelaws. This was a slow process requiring the approval of the Secretary of State.

Under the 1996 Act, a district council or unitary authority may itself designate areas of land to which the Act applies in accordance with regulations issued by the Secretary of State. Pembrokeshire County Council has designated the whole of the County as an area covered by the Act. This applies from 1st June 2000.

With certain exceptions, the Act applies to all land which is open to the air on at least one side and to which the public have access, with or without payment.

Exceptions include land comprising or running alongside a highway for which the speed limit is over 40 mph, land used for agriculture or for woodlands, and which is predominantly marshland, moor or heath and common land (s 1).

It is an offence for a person in charge of a dog not to remove forthwith faeces left by a dog following defecation on designated land (s 3). No offence is committed if the person has a reasonable excuse or the owner, occupier, etc, of the land has given consent. Registered blind persons are excepted.

Provision is made for the issue of fixed penalty notices by local authority officers. (s 4). The fixed penalty is £25. There are also powers to prosecute through the courts.

PRESS RELEASE

NEW RULES ON CLEAN-UP

From 1st June 2000, owners who do not clear up after their dogs will be breaking the law. Pembrokeshire County Council has designated the whole of the County as an area covered by the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996. This applies from 1st June 2000. Council officers will be able to issue fixed penalty notices. The fixed penalty is £25. There are also powers to prosecute through the courts.

The Dog Wardens of Pembrokeshire County Council are enthusiastic about the new powers to ensure a cleaner County. Debbie Hart, Sally Bland and Lisa Jones hope that the public will come forward to provide information about irresponsible dog owners who let their dogs foul in public places with the resulting mess, nuisance and health concerns.

Sally Bland says, "Although we carry out regular patrols of problem areas, the owners often walk their dogs early in the morning and late in the evening at times when they believe no-one will pay attention. We rely on the public to inform us when this is happening so that we can plan our patrols."

In Pembrokeshire it is now an offence if the person in charge of a dog does not immediately remove faeces left by a dog, unless the owner or occupier of the land has given consent. This applies to land open to the air on at least one side and to which the public have access, with or without payment. Registered blind persons are excepted.

There are some exceptions, which include land comprising or running alongside a highway for which the speed limit is over 40 mph, land used for agriculture or for woodlands, and land which is predominantly marshland, moor or heath and common land.

Sally Bland, Dog Warden, says "These new powers are a great improvement on the previous situation where the controls only covered footpaths and grass verges. We have produced new posters, and bin stickers, as well as promotional poop-scoop bags. We urge all dog owners to 'bag it and bin it' using lined litter bins or their own bins at home."
