149. PRESENTATION ON RECYCLING

Rebecca Whalley, Waste Awareness Officer, Pembrokeshire County Council, gave a presentation on Recycling in which she covered the following topics:

In March 2004 pilot schemes were introduced in some areas of Pembrokeshire which have proved to be extremely successful. The scheme will expand to Pembroke and Pembroke Dock in June 2005. Pembrokeshire County Council will be contacting all Community Councils and Town Councils in the area with information within the next few weeks. Before the scheme starts, Awareness Meetings will be held and a card will be sent informing residents that the scheme is coming to their area. This will be followed by distribution of bags, tags and a covering letter and guide on how to participate.

The Town Clerk reported that he had written to Pembrokeshire County Council requesting an on-site meeting with the Highways and Transportation Department, but had received no response.

(b) **Minute 138(d) – Pembroke Dock One9T Committee Hiring Charges in respect of Pater Hall**

Councillor P. Weatherall reported that following discussion with the Monitoring Officer, in future he would declare an interest and leave the meeting when this matter was being discussed.

(c) **Minute 138(f) – Donations – Age Concern Pembrokeshire**

Councillor Mrs. V.M.J. Roach reported that she had received a letter from Age Concern thanking the Council for their generous donation.

(d) **Minute 138(g) – Upper Gwyther Street Entrance – Memorial Park**

The Town Clerk reported a letter from Pembrokeshire County Council stating that the wooden gate had been replaced with a galvanized steel gate to reduce maintenance liability.

Councillor Mrs. V.M.J. Roach stated that this was not the gate that she had previously referred to.

The Town Clerk undertook to contact Pembrokeshire County Council.

Following discussion it was agreed that schools should be encouraged to be more involved with the Winter Carnival. There had been a lot of support from individuals but less from organisations. The Town Clerk stated that letters had been sent to all schools and organisations in the Town.

(g) Minute 176– Pembroke Dock Festival 2005

The Town Clerk reported that letters are being sent to organisations inviting them to send up to two representatives to the meeting being held on Monday January 31st.

A grant of £1250 had been received from Pembrokeshire Tourism towards 50% of marketing costs. As the Festival coincides with Pembrokeshire Fish Week, some joint publicity would be required to satisfy the grant conditions.

The Town Clerk reported that a donation of £500 would be received from the Milford Haven Port Authority and tickets and vouchers from Irish Ferries. Texaco were considering the matter at their next meeting.

(h) Minute 145(d) – Speeding – Military Road

The Town Clerk reported that two letters had been received regarding this matter. The Street Lighting Engineer had replied stating that previous requests to upgrade the existing street lighting along Military Road remain on file awaiting the necessary funds. Funds that have been made available had been utilised to install lighting on highways with no previous lighting. Therefore, Military Road will remain on file.

Inspector Matthews had replied stating that he would be passing on a copy of the Town Clerk's letter to the Roads Policing Unit. He suggested that the Council also write to the Speed Camera Partnership who are responsible for siting the mobile speed camera van.

184. Town Awards Scheme

The Town Clerk reported that since the Council introduced a Town Awards Scheme in 2001 the format of the scheme had been as follows:-

- (a) Nominations were limited to residents in Pembroke Dock.
- (b) There would be two categories of Awards:-
 - (a) Award of Merit
 - (b) Certificate of Commendationto be awarded to individuals or organisations in the Town.
- (c) Nominations received would be considered by an Awards Committee consisting of all Members of the Pembroke Dock Town Council.
- (d) The number of awards made in any one year would be at the discretion of the Awards Committee.
- (e) The awards would be presented at an Awards Ceremony.

No Award Scheme had been held last year, when it was decided that in future the scheme would be held biennially.

Assuming that the scheme would be held this year, the Town Clerk is arranging for a press release with a closing date of 17th February, 2005 to be advertised, to allow for consideration by the Awards Committee and for presentation arrangements to be made.

185. New Licensing Laws

The Town Clerk had previously reported (September 2nd 2004) details of the new licensing laws contained in the Licensing Act 2003. The County Council would begin to deal with applications for transfer of licences to the new legislation as from February 2005.

This would affect licences such as liquor, public entertainment, theatre, cinema and late night refreshment.

The new laws would bring new opportunities for Town and Community Councils to influence the way in which premises were operated in their area.

The County Council's Licensing Team invited representatives to a seminar on the new laws which included speakers from the Licensing Team and Dyfed Powys Police. The seminar was held on Monday 17th January, 2005 in Committee Room I, County Hall, Haverfordwest, and commenced at 7.00pm.

The invitation was for two representatives.

RESOLVED –

186. Townscape Heritage Initiative Steering Group

The Town Clerk had received from Councillor D.L. Jones, the Council's representative on the Steering Group, copies of the notes of the meetings held on 20th October and 1st December 2004. These were available for Members' inspection.

Application was being made to the Heritage Lottery Fund for an extension of the five year scheme which will end in March 2006. As the application had been made by Christmas 2004, the Town Clerk had sent the Townscape Heritage Officer a letter of support from the Town Council.

The Town Clerk enclosed at Appendix 'A' a letter from the Heritage Officer, which requested the Council to consider making a financial commitment to the proposed extension of the scheme.

Councillor D.L. Jones detailed for Members' information, a progress report in respect of the various buildings included in the Townscape Heritage Initiative.

Discussion on the Heritage Officer's request for a financial contribution from the Town Council was deferred until later in the meeting, when the budget estimates for 2005/6 were being considered.

187. The Louisa Saunders Trust

The Secretary to the Trust, Councillor Dillwyn Davies, had informed the Town Clerk that the Council's representative, former Councillor Mrs. P. Williamson, was now unable to attend meetings of the Trust, due to ill health.

He had asked that the Council consider appointing a replacement.

Following discussion, it was agreed to postpone appointing a replacement until the next meeting, when more information about the Trust would be available.

**190. Providing Indemnities to Members and Officers
(Section 101, Local Government Act 2000)**

A copy of a consultation document had been received from the Welsh Assembly Government and was available for perusal.

There had been uncertainty about the extent of the powers of authorities to indemnify their members and officers out of public funds for any personal liability arising from actions or decisions taken by them in the course of their official duties.

Doubts had arisen, however, about the extent to which authorities could provide indemnities, particularly where individuals incurred personal liability for their actions on external bodies, such as partnership bodies, joint venture companies or charitable trusts, to which they had been appointed by their authority, and the scope to cover actions that were ultra vires or involved negligence.

Responses to the questions raised in the paper had to be submitted by March 1st 2005.

Members considered the provisional estimates for the 2005/6 financial year. In preparing the estimates the Financial Officer had consulted with the Company Secretary of the Pater Hall Community Trust which will be operating from April 1st 2005. The rent payable to the Trust in respect of the Council Offices and Chamber had been included together with the estimated donation to the Trust under Section 19 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976.

It was resolved that the following amendments be made to the provisional estimates:-

- a) Mayor's allowance increase from £1,650 to £2,000.
- b) A Deputy Mayor's allowance of £500 be included.
- c) £500 included for new crockery and cutlery in Chamber kitchen.
- d) Donation to the Pembroke Dock Museum Trust increased from £1,000 to £2,000.
- e) Donation of £3,000 to the Townscape Heritage Initiative.
- f) Transfer to the Tourism Committee increase from £2,000 to £4,000.

These amendments increase the estimated expenditure by £7,350.
