### (a) <u>Minute 7(g) – Bus Shelter – High Street, Pennar</u>

The Town Clerk reported that he had received a reply from Pembrokeshire County Council in response to his letter of 4<sup>th</sup> April 2005 requesting the replacement of the Bus Shelter in High Street, Pennar. The letter stated that the replacement of the bus shelter had been held up due to the presence of a BT chamber, over which BT would not allow a new shelter to be built. A preliminary design had been prepared which allowed repositioning of the shelter away from the chamber, but BT were still not satisfied with the layout. An alternative layout is now being worked on to present for BT's approval, and until a design has been confirmed the Council are unable to offer a timescale as to when the shelter would be erected.
