14. ELECTION OF MAYOR

The Mayor, Councillor Mrs. P.E. George invited nominations for the position of Mayor for the ensuing year.

Councillor Mrs. V.M.J. Roach nominated Councillor Mrs. P.E.M. Folland the Mayor Elect as Mayor.

PROPOSED by Councillor Mrs. V.M.J. Roach SECONDED by Councillor R.F. Finbow

RESOLVED -

That Councillor Mrs. P.E.M. Folland be appointed as Mayor for the year 2000/2001.

Councillor W.S. Rees paid tribute to Councillor Mrs. P.E. George who had undertaken the role of Mayor and had been an excellent ambassador for the Town.

Councillor Mrs. P.E.M. Folland thanked Councillors for the confidence that they had shown in electing her as Mayor.

15. <u>APPOINTMENT OF DEPUTY MAYOR</u>

The Mayor, Councillor Mrs. P.E.M. Folland invited nominations for the position of Deputy Mayor for the ensuing year.



Councillor R.F. Finbow nominated Councillor D.T. Esmond the Deputy Mayor Elect.

PROPOSED by Councillor R.F. Finbow SECONDED by Councillor Mrs. V.M.J. Roach

RESOLVED -

That Councillor D.T. Esmond be appointed as Deputy Mayor for the year 2000/2001.

Councillor D.T. Esmond thanked Councillors for the confidence that they had shown in electing him as Deputy Mayor.

16. PATER HALL - MOBILE CINEMA

The Mayor welcomed Mr. R.L. Manson who had attended the Meeting to discuss the possible provision of a Mobile Cinema in Pater Hall.

RESOLVED -

- (1) That the Council agree to a mobile cinema screening at Pater Hall for a trial period of twelve weeks on a Wednesday with a hiring charge of £25 per night to Mr. R.L. Manson.
- (2) That the cost of cinema licensing and any registered door person requirements to be the responsibility of Mr. R.L. Manson.

17. MINUTES

PROPOSED by Councillor R.F. Finbow SECONDED by Councillor M.B. Owen

RESOLVED -

That the Minutes of the meeting held on the 6th April, 2000 be adopted as circulated subject to the following amendments:-

18. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

(a) Minute 3(a) - Millennium Souvenirs

The Town Clerk stated that the District Auditor had advised that the purchase of the above plates was not to be undertaken through the Council and would have to be privately purchased.



(b) Minute 3(e)- Town Trail

The Town Clerk reported that he had discussed the mater with the National Park Authority who had advised that the sign sighting was at present a problem as there were insufficent lamp posts in the Rocky Park area. It was hoped that this would be rectified in the near future.

(c) Minute 6 - A477 St. Clears to Pembroke Dock

The Town Clerk reported that he had received a reply from the Welsh Assembly in which it was stated that the upgrading of the A477 will be undertaken as quickly as possible. However, progress may be determined by other demands and the need to consider other competing schemes in the trunk road programme.

RESOLVED -

That representations be submitted to Mr. Ainger MP and the Welsh Asembly that three laned highways (alternating where this is a uphill section) should be provided on both the A40 and A477 as a matter of urgency in view of the ever increasing volume of freight travelling from the ferry terminals at Pembroke Dock and Fishguard.

(d) Minute 11(b) - Llanion Park - Artefacts

Councillor P.G. Gwyther enquired as to whether a date had been provided by Councillor B.J. Hall with regard to the handing over of the artefacts to this Council.

The Town Clerk stated that his predecessor, Mrs. Vincent had been unable to establish a date with County Councillor B.J. Hall.

RESOLVED -

That the Town Clerk liaise with County Councillor B.J. Hall with regard to the handing over of the artefacts to this Council.

(e) Minute 11(d) - 10 Albany Street - Potholes

Councillor Mrs. V.M.J. Roach stated that she had referred to the potholes outside No. 2 Bufferland Terrace which should have been included in the Minutes.

RESOLVED -

That Pembrokeshire County Council be requested to undertake necessary repair work at No. 2 Bufferland Terrace.

16. Mobile Cinema - Pater Hall

The Town Clerk stated that at the last Council Meeting he had been asked to submit a report on the request to use the Pater Hall as a Mobile Cinema, from Mr. R.L. Manson of Newport, Pembs. (Appendix "A"). Mr. Manson had been invited to attend and the following was submitted for consideration by the Council.

(a) Cinema Licence

Pembrokeshire County Council had advised that a mobile cinema could operate for up to six occasions in a year without a licence. The County Council must be informed, in writing, seven days before each showing.

To operate for more than six occasions, a cinema licence would have to be applied for at a cost of £189.

(b) Insurance

The Council's insurers had been contacted. Should the operator not have his own Public Liability cover, the Council's Hirers' Liability insurance (£1 million limit of indemnity) would provide cover. The Council also have Public Liability cover for £2 million.

(c) Hiring Charge

If the proposal was to be agreed to, the hourly hiring charge would have to be determined since the current scale does not specifically include cinema operation. The current scale includes the following:-

Plays, Concerts and other events with a seated audience £5.75 per hour (£8.25 after 10 pm and all day Saturday, Sunday and Bank Holidays)

Dances, Discos, etc. where charge made for admission (Minimum 2 hours) £12.25 per hour (£16.25 after 10 pm and all day Saturday, Sunday and Bank Holidays).

This matter had been dealt with under Minute No. 16(2000/2001).

17. Pater Hall - Gates

The Town Clerk reported that following the discussion at the last Council Meeting regarding the new gates, Mr. P. Floyd of Galvanised Gates, Swansea had attended the Pater Hall on the 20th April, 2000. Present at the meeting were the Mayor, Councillor D.L. Jones and himself.

The Council informed Mr. Floyd of all the concerns raised at the last meeting, and discussed possible alterations and modifications.

He agreed that he had omitted to provide for the gates to be locked against the wall when open, as per his quotation, and he would undertake the necessary alteration. With regard to the Council motifs incorporated into the design of the gates, he would consider ways of improving them and provide details as soon as possible.

The Town Clerk reported that to date no details of the proposed amendments had been received.

RESOLVED -

That the Town Clerk be instructed to liaise with Galvanised Gates regarding this matter.

18. <u>Door Supervisors Course</u>

The Town Clerk stated that when the Caretaker, Mr. J. Jones was appointed he agreed to consider attending a Door Supervisors Course, leading to becoming a Registered Door Person.



Members were advised that the two day courses are run by Pembrokeshire County Council and cover Public Entertainment Licence conditions, drug and alcohol awareness, HIV, Aids, violence etc. The next course will be at the end of May, possibly in Pembroke Dock. The cost of the course is £31.

Mr. Jones has agreed to attend if required, cover for some of his Caretaker duties would be required and consideration given as to his remuneration during part of two days.

Where appropriate, organisations hiring the Pater Hall are told to engage their own Registered Door Persons. It would be of mutual benefit to the Council and Mr. Jones if he were to attend the relevant course.

RESOLVED -

- That Mr. J. Jones, Caretaker attend a Door Supervisors Course at a cost of £31.00 payable by the Council.
- (2) That Mr. Jones receive remuneration of two days pay of 8 hours, 16 hours in total from the Council.
- (3) That the Council approve payment of £31,00 for the Door Supervisors Course.

19. Dog Fouling - Memorial Park

The Town Clerk referred to the last meeting when he contacted Pembrokeshire County Council with a request that consideration be given to the introduction of dog fouling byelaws in the Memorial Park and also the provision of bins.

The Housing and Environmental Division advised that the provisions of the Dogs (Fouling of Land)Act, 1996 are to be implemented in Pembrokeshire from the 1st June, 2000. It will then become an offence if dog owners do not clear up after their dogs.

The County Council have no budget provision for the purchase of signs or dog waste bins during the year 2000/1 and recommend that Town and Community Councils identify problem sites and erect their own signs (with permission of landowners). Signs are available from local or specialist national sign manufacturers. Signs are also available from the County Council's Dog Warden Service consisting of adhesive labels on aluminium plates at a cost of £10 each.

Councillor Mrs. P.E. George stated that an additional bin had been provided for use by dog owners but had not been emptied and that an additional bin was required.

RESOLVED -

That Pembrokeshire County Council be requested to provide another bin at the top end of the Park and that the bins be emptied every week.

20. Floral Displays - Update

The Town Clerk submitted a report on the current situation with regard to the floral displays as follows:-

- (a) Pembrokeshire County Council had confirmed that they have no objection to the Council's proposals subject to the following conditions:-
 - (i) To make the said installation in all respects in a proper and workmanlike manner.
 - (ii) To hold the Authority harmless and indemnified at all times hereafter from and against all claims damages costs and expenses arising out of any accident injury or damage to persons or property in consequence of the said installation and to make good any damage caused to the said premises thereby.
 - (iii) To remove temporarily the said installation after reasonable notice where necessary during any repair/replacement of the columns.
- (b) The quotation from Pembroke Nurseries, Slade Cross, for the filling of the flower baskets in the sum of £11 per basket had been accepted and the order given. They will also fix the baskets at a charge of £5 per hour per person.
- (c) Ledwood Construction Ltd., have the necessary equipment for fixing the brackets to the lighting columns and they had agreed to loan it to the Council.
- (d) Mr. J. Jones, Caretaker, agreed to water the baskets on a weekly basis on the terms decided at the last meeting (unsociable hourly rate with a minimum of 3 hours).

21. <u>Public Entertainment Licence Regulations -</u> Theatre Licence Regulations - Pater Hall

The Town Clerk referred to the application made to Pembrokeshire County Council for the transfer of the Public Entertainment and Theatre Licences in respect of the Pater Hall to his name. When the licences are issued they will be in his sole name as Licensee.

One of the licence conditions in both sets of Regulations is as follows:-

"The Licensee or some other responsible person of at least eighteen years of age and authorised by the Licensee in writing (the Nominee) shall be present on the premises throughout the time that the premises are open for Public Entertainment."



The Town Clerk stated that it would not be practicable for him to be present at all times and in accordance with the Regulations it was suggested that the Caretaker, Mr. J. Jones be nominated as the Council's nominee. He would normally be present throughout the relevant time.

RESOLVED -

That Mr. J. Jones and Mrs. M. Bittle be nominated in accordance with the Public Entertainment Licence Regulations.

22. Postal Franking Machine

The Town Clerk reported that Pitney Bowes had advised the Council that it's current franking machine will no longer be compliant after October, 2002.

Pitney Bowes recommended based on our mailing volume, purchase of a new digital franking machine and electronic scale, normally retailing at £595, for £295. The offer is conditional on taking out a Pitney Bowes Maintenance Coverplan at £9.99 per month. In addition they also offer seven pre-loaded advertising messages to personalise every letter and a £200 Royal Mail voucher.

The fully comprehensive maintenance contract for the current machine costs £71.87 (+VAT) per annum.

RESOLVED -

That the Council approve the purchase of a digital franking machine and electronic scale for £295.

22. Pembroke & Pembroke Dock Amateur Boxing Club

The Town Clerk reproduced at Appendix "B" a copy of a letter received from the Head Trainer of the Pembroke & Pembroke Dock Amateur Boxing Club. The Club have to vacate it's premises at the rear of the East Gate School, Pembroke on the 26th May, 2000 and were looking for a new base. Pembrokeshire County Council, their current landlord, is currently investigating ways of helping the Club. They are also requested the help of this Authority.

RESOLVED -

That the Boxing Club be advised that the Council regrets the fact that they are unable to assist them in this matter. It is hoped that the Sports Development Department, Pembrokeshire County Council will be able to locate suitable premises.

23. New Traffic Order - Lower Pennar

The Town Clerk reproduced at Appendix "C" a letter from Pembrokeshire County Council detailing proposals for the introduction of one way traffic on the road linking the east end of Castle Street to Grove Street. Members' views on the matter were requested, together with clarification on the name of the road concerned.

RESOLVED -

That Pembrokeshire County Council be informed that the road concerned is known as Lewis Hill and the introduction of a one way traffic flow on this road was approved.

24. <u>Applicatin for Grant of Public Entertainment Licence -</u> Alexandra Vaults, 39 <u>Dimond Street</u>

The Town Clerk reported that comments on this application were requested by the 25th April, 2000. The hours applied for are Monday -Sunday 11 am - 11 p.m.

The local Ward Members had been contacted and had raised no objection. Pembrokeshire County Council were advised accordingly.

25. News Reports - Irish Ferry Terminal

The Town Clerk stated that following discussion on this matter at the last meeting, a reply had been received from BBC Wales which was reproduced at Appendix "D"

26. Grass Cutting

The Town Clerk referred to the discussion at the last meeting when it was resolved to request Pembrokeshire County Council to pick up grass cuttings after mowing. A reply had been received and was reproduced at Appendix "E".

Councillor Mrs. P.E. George referred to the appalling condition of Llanion Cemetery with regard to grass cutting.



RESOLVED -

That Pembrokeshire County Council be advised of the Council's concern over the appalling state of the grass cutting undertaken at Llanion Cemetery and request that immediate action be taken to rectify this matter.

27. Works to Streets in Pembroke Dock

The Town Clerk reproduced at Appendix "F" copy of a letter from Mr. G. Scourfield, Pembroke Design which expressed his concern at the method of some recent street repairs.

(c) Railway Line - Dimond Street

Councillor D.L. Jones once again referred to the appalling condition of the disused railway line at the rear of Dimond Street.

RESOLVED -

That the Town Clerk establish ownership of the line and submit representations regarding the need for remedial work to be undertaken as priority.

(d) Pater Hall - Redecoration

Councillor D.L. Jones referred to the need for Pater Hall to be redecorated externally as well as internally and that the windows needed replacing.

The Town Clerk stated that his predecessor had agreed with the Dyfed Probation Officer the possibility of painting the exterior of Pater Hall by them. He had also discussed the question of redecoration of the Hall with the Caretaker, Mr. J. Jones who was prepared to undertake this work.

RESOLVED -

That the Town Clerk be instructed to discuss this matter with the Dyfed Probation Services Officer and Mr. Jones and submit report back to the next Council Meeting.

(e) National Westminster Bank - Branch Closure

Members expressed their concern and referred to the fact that parking for customers was easier in Pembroke Dock than in Pembroke.

An enhancement scheme was being prepared to improve the overall appearance of the area and once implemented the scheme would include litter bins.

Councillor Mrs. V.M.J. Roach advised that one litter bin had been taken from Albion Square and was now in situ.

RESOLVED -

That Pembrokeshire County Council be requested to advise what the enhancement scheme is and when it will be implemented.

(k) Pembrokeshire County Council - Rent Cards

Councillor Mrs. B. Roch reported that she had received a complaint from an elderly person regarding lack of information on the Council Rent Cards and to the fact that there had been an increase which had not been explained causing the person great anxiety.

RESOLVED -

That Pembrokeshire County Council be requested to provide clear and concise information on the Council Rent Cards.

(l) Mayoral Chain - Repair

The Mayor, Councillor Mrs. P.E.M. Folland stated that two links on the Mayoral chain were on the wrong way round and needed to be reversed.

Madam Mayor, Ladies and Gentlemen,

PART I - GENERAL

31. PATER HALL - REDECORATION

(a) External

Your previous Town Clerk had discussions with the Dyfed Probation Service with regard to the possibility of them painting the exterior of Pater Hall. I have now reopened these discussions and have had a meeting with Miss D. Quinnell of the Probation Service.

The Probation Service would be prepared to undertake the painting of windows, doors and rainwater goods. The work would be done by persons on Community Service Orders and would be fully supervised. Labour costs are met by the Probation Service, with the Council paying for the paint, brushes etc. The Probation Service have their own 20' tower scaffolding which would have to be stored securely during the contract period.

Because of current commitments the earliest starting date would be the end of June/July, 2000 and the preferred time for doing the work would be on a Sunday. The reason for this is that the tower scaffolding will cause some obstruction and that there would be fewer people in the streets on a Sunday.

(b) Internal

Mr. J. Jones, Caretaker/Handyman, has inspected the building, internally and externally and has prepared a schedule of general maintenance work, which he is prepared to undertake.

Apart from the external painting, works which he considers as priority are as follows:-

- (i) Redecoration of Kitchen and Refreshment Room;
- (ii) Toilet area in Town Clerk's Office and Secretary's Office;
- (iii) Windows in Main Hall opening mechanism repairs and painting.

32. PATER HALL GATES

33. DISUSED RAILWAY LINE - REAR OF DIMOND STREET

At the last Council Meeting, I was asked to establish the ownership of the disused railway line at the rear of Dimond Street. Following many enquiries the position is as follows:-

(a) Section from Water Street to Gordon Street

I have been able to ascertain that this section is owned by the Govan Davies family. I have discussed the overgrown condition of it with Mr. Phillip Davies and he has given his consent to any clearance work the Council wish to do. He has previously requested the owner of the dilapidated vehicle to removed it and promises to do so again.

(b) Section from Gordon Street to Lower Meyrick Street

My enquiries have revealed that this section is in the ownership of a company under the control of Mr. B. Angell of the Cleddau Bridge Hotel. He has given his verbal consent for clearance work to be undertaken.

The Dyfed Probation Service are prepared to carry out the necessary work. Although both landowners have given verbal consent Members may wish to have this in writing before entering on the land.





Re: Proposal to use Pater Hall for Mobile Cinema.

Further to the meeting of last month, your letter and our recent telephone conversation, I am writing with regard to the proposed terms for use of the Hall. Your current proposal would involve our incurring costs of £25 per session ental plus upto a further £26 per session for supervisory staff, which I'm concerned would likely prove to be financial inhibitive. Accordingly, I would propose the following terms:

- That we proceed in the immediate future upon the basis of a rental of £25 per session on a Wednesday evening. That, in the longer term, I am prepared to pay 10% of admission fees as rental, with a guaranteed minimum of
 - £25 (n.b. distributors will account for upto 45% + VAT of takings, in addition to other overheads, costs etc.).
 - That the care-taker will be available to help with the moving of equipment before and after the screening.
- That for the duration of the screening the care-taker will remain in the auditorium in a supervisory capacity. For your information I have had it confirmed by Pembrokeshire County Council - Licencing Department that a registered door-person is not required for a cinema screening.
 - That with respect to the fee for a Cinema Licence for the Hall I propose that your Council meet the initial sum, as required by the County Council, but that I shall reimburse you, in full, in 12 equal monthly instalments

There is a further matter of concern, which was touched on only in passing at our meeting in Council, but which on reflection I now feel needs to be clarified. It concerns the need for a reciprocal commitment between us as to (a) the exclusive use of The Pater Hall by myself for cinema screenings in the Pembroke Dock locality, and (b) the exclusive use of my services and operation for all such screenings. To be clear I propose that we have a written agreement establishing that I will not operate cinema screenings in any alternate venue in the vicinity of Pembroke Dock (incld. Pembroke), which secures my commitment to the use of The Pater Hall, in return for which I would seek a commitment to the exclusive use of my services for any and all moving picture screenings which take place in the Hall.

Rather, specifically, I seek For the avoidance of doubt, 1 do not seek to pre-empt a successful outcome of the trial period we have agreed to, at this point in time a commitment that <u>should</u> such a decision to continue with screenings be made, your Council will agree to the exclusive provision of my services to do so as above.
