St Govans Centre

It was questioned if there had been any progress with the shutters facing Meyrick, it was commented that the funding application for the Town Council was turned down so the group was struggling for funding, Sally commented that she would speak to the St Govans Centre Owner to get funding for the project to go ahead.

Sally Bearne questioned if St Govans Centre could be more involved in festivals and events within the town, she commented that a Christmas market could be held in the Centre to add to the Winter Festival. James questioned if the route of the Lantern Parade could be changed, Sarah stated that the Festival group would need to be approached as they are the organisers of this event.

Sally commented that she had concerns regarding the stained glass above the entrance to the centre, she stated that she wanted to make more of a feature of it and try and have it restored, it was agreed that Sally should contact springboard who are currently running courses to see if they would take this restoration on as part of a project.

Sally questioned if anyone had ideas of what could be done regarding the boarded windows which faced onto harbour way, it was suggested that the Art department from Pembroke School was contacted to see if fake windows could be painted onto boards to make it look a bit tidier.

The service lane between St Govans Centre was an issue which was raised, Sally confirmed that the section of land was owned by the owners of the spar. She stated that there are 3 skips there which are for the Red cross, Hasty Bite and one of the charity shops, she stated that she is regularly removing rubbish from this area, Sarah stated that the Town Council Street cleaner often removes rubbish too. James stated that the group should contact the County Council and request that they take this piece of land on, Sarah informed the group that it is very unlikely that the County Council will take on this section of land especially with the looming budget cuts. Lee stated that this could be a project for the future the group agreed.

WIFI

Sarah stated that further to a meeting with the County Council, the initial proposal was being reviewed due to costs. Sally confirmed that the St Govans Centre had open WIFI access to the public, it was questioned if the Pater Hall had the same, Sarah stated that she thought the Pater Hall WIFI was secured and a password was required to access it. Lee stated that the range for St Govans WIFI probably covered most of the middle of Dimond Street so the town WIFI service would not benefit the town.

James questioned if the Christmas tree could also be moved, Sarah commented that ideas of locations should be passed to her. James suggested that Dimond
